LOGIN

OVERVIEW

This section is in the McMaster CV. All publications should be included. Publications must be sorted into the categories and subheadings listed in the McMaster CV Guidelines.

BEST PRACTICE

Formatting of all entries should be consistent. Per the guidelines: The sequence of authors must be the exact replica of the sequence in which the manuscript was published. Do not add, remove, or reorder names. Contributions to books must include chapter title(s). Accepted for Publication should be in final form. Submitted publications must include the date submitted.
